### Sticky knowledge

#### Geography

This half term we will be focussing on the oceans of the world. We will understand the difference between a sea (close to land) and an ocean (away from land) and use the Equator, North and South Pole to locate them. We will use Atlases and globes to identify them on a map. We will understand the human impact on the oceans and the damage this is doing to the world's marine life. Thus reinforcing the need to reduce, reuse and recycle to ensure the oceans thrive in the future.

Writing outcome: To write information about the sea animals looked at in the texts.

- Link ideas through subject or pronoun e.g. Bats are black. They fly at night

#### Science

We will be looking at how plants grow in the summer and compare this with growth during winter and spring. We will also be continuing our seasons work by looking at the Summer season in detail.
