The Queen's Jubilee 2022

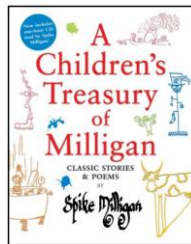

Mrs. Castle



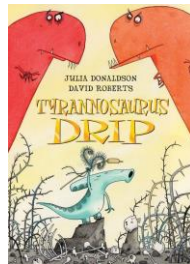

The children in Y1 have picked a few of their favourite books:

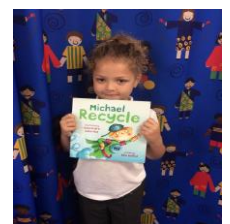
