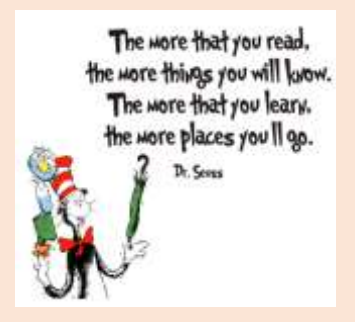

Books definitely! I like the feel of a book in my hands, turning the pages and flicking back and forth to re-read, even having a sneaky look at the end!

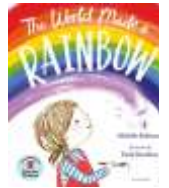
Where do you most like to read?

Snuggled up on my settee with a cup of tea as I tend to fall relax and asleep if I read in bed! 😊



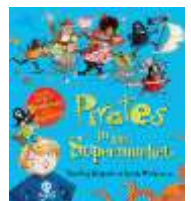
### Nursery's recommended reads:
