Playground markings – £2975.00  Annual inspection £53.30  Playground equipment £395.97	Playground improvements to provide gross motor opportunities.	New playground markings and design to encourage active playtimes, following footprint track and fitness instructions. New games e.g. what is the time Mr wolf and playleaders to facilitate, active lunchtimes. Impact was improvement in behaviour and physical activity during the lunch period.
£2871.00	Swimming	All children in year 2 had access to blocks of swimming lessons. Children became more confident in water, have learnt about water safety and learnt a life-saving skill which they will have for life. Many of our children would not otherwise have access to swimming lessons.
£5775.50	Complete PE Sport's coach.	CPD/ training for all staff members on areas of development for complete PE e.g. dance. Ensuring staff are confident to teach the PE

		curriculum. This has also meant that staff are upskilled to deliver high quality PE lessons. Staff voice and lesson observations shows that staff feel confident to deliver PE effectively. Assessment training for PE co-ordinator to ensure children's progress is monitored. This understanding will impact future years to ensure that any children falling behind can receive an intervention or additional support.
£450	Outside provider enrichment days	An outside provider was employed to deliver high quality enrichment days in Key Stage 1. Children received an Olympic Day, Judo enrichment, giving them the chance to develop skills and enjoyment in activities that they may not normally be exposed to.
£1000.00	Forest school's training	Full training for class teacher on how to effectively teach Forest Schools sessions. This training will also be passed on to the rest of the staff team to upskill all staff in delivering Forest Schools sessions in future years. Children will develop their fine and gross motor skills during these sessions as well as gain knowledge on how to lead a healthy outdoor lifestyle.
£562.93	PE equipment	Old or broken equipment to support PE lessons have been replaced meaning children have access to good quality sports equipment during PE sessions. Stickers have been purchased for children to receive at Sports Day, encouraging pride amongst the children for their sporting efforts. Sports equipment for lunchtimes has also been updated/replenished. Quality equipment has meant that children have a greater engagement with sport and physical activity, forming life-long good habits.
£400	Life education	A whole school programme, focussing on health and active lifestyles. Impact – children developing lifelong healthy habits.
